Derek Jones first came to the American Job center early June from Community Corrections. Mr. Jones stated at first, he was nervous, his anxiety was high due to being locked up for so long and hadn't had time to adapt to being out in the community. When he came to the American Job Center, he knew he wanted to find employment, learn about resumes, and use a computer. Mr. Jones worked with AJC staff to create an email account and began searching for employment. Mr. Jones stated, "I felt staff were nice so I felt comfortable and could let my guard down." Mr. Jones successfully gained full-time employment with BMS. Mr. Jones has now been paroled and is living on his own. Recently, Mr. Jones returned to the AJC as he wanted to search for part-time employment. Mr. Jones stated, "I love it here in the AJC and I look forward to coming down here to encourage others from the center and to tell them to stay focus and don't lose site of their freedom and family." Mr. Jones feels his experience was great and the AJC is a learning place that he recommends to everyone. "I tell everyone, even people who are homeless, you don't have to sleep on street, and you can find a job with the help from the American Job Center."
